

2020 GENERAL PRIMARY UMOVA NOTICE

What the Notice Must Include

- A list of all offices and ballot measures (referenda) that the county expects to be on the ballot at the upcoming primary or election.
- Specific instructions for how a covered voter is to indicate his/her choices for each office and each ballot measure on the Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot (FWAB)

When the Notice Must be Available

- A county must prepare the election notice at least 90 days before a primary or election
- For a special election, the notice must be prepared at soon as practicable

Availability of the Notice

- A county that maintains a publicly accessible website MUST make the notice and updated versions of the notice available on its website.
- If a covered voter requests a copy of the notice, the county must deliver it by email, over the Internet or by regular mail as the voter requests.

Updating the Notice

- As the names of candidates for the various offices and ballot questions become available, the notice must be promptly updated to include the names of those candidates and specific information about the ballot questions.
- The updated notice must be publicly available.

NOTE: It is sufficient to provide a list of candidates as an addendum to the notice, provided the list clearly identifies the office for which each candidate is running.

Instructions

The notice must contain the following instructions regarding voting by absentee ballot:

- You may request an absentee ballot from this office at any time prior to a primary or election. However, if time does not permit you to receive and return an official absentee ballot, you are also entitled to vote using the Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot (FWAB).
- You may use the FWAB to vote for a candidate for President of the United States and U.S. Representative (Representative in Congress) as well as candidates for all state and local offices, and ballot initiatives.
- To vote, refer to page 3 of the FWAB.
 - To vote for President of the United States and U.S. Representative (Representative in Congress) – write in the name of the candidate in the space provided on the FWAB.
 - To vote for state and local offices or for ballot initiatives – write the names of candidates or the ballot initiative in the Addendum Section of the FWAB

- Under the **Office/Ballot Initiative** heading, enter the office the candidate is running for or the title of the Ballot Initiative (referendum).
- Under the **Candidate Name, Party Affiliation or Initiative Vote** heading, list the name of the candidate you wish to vote for, or if you are voting on a Referendum questions write “yes” or “no.”

Official Notice of Election for Military and Overseas Voters County of Carbon

2020 General Election (November 3, 2020)

This is an official notice of a Primary election to be conducted on 4/28/2020 in Carbon County. You may register to vote and request an official absentee ballot by using the Federal Postcard Application (FPCA), available at www.votespa.com or www.fvap.gov. You may apply for an absentee ballot by submitting your FPCA by email to lisadart@carboncounty.net.

You may request an absentee ballot from this office at any time prior to a primary or election. However, if time does not permit you to receive and return an official absentee ballot, you are also entitled to vote using the Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot (FWAB). Military electors may also use the FWAB to register to vote and vote simultaneously.

You may use the FWAB to vote for a candidate for President of the United States and U.S. Representative (Representative in Congress) as well as candidates for all state and local offices, and ballot initiatives.

To vote, refer to page 3 of the FWAB.

To vote for President of the United States and U.S. Representative (Representative in Congress), write in the name of the candidate of your choice in the space provided on the FWAB.

To vote for state and local offices or for ballot initiatives, write the names of candidates or ballot initiatives in the Addendum section of the FWAB. Under the **Office/Ballot Initiative** heading, enter the office the candidate is running for or the title of the Ballot Initiative (referendum). Under the **Candidate Name, Party Affiliation or Initiative Vote** heading, list the name of the candidate you wish to vote for, or if you are voting on a Referendum questions write "yes" or "no."

REPRESENTATIVE IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY – 122nd Senatorial District – Vote for One – Townships of Banks, East Penn (Districts 7 & 8), Franklin (Districts 11, 12 & 13), Kidder (Districts 20 & 21), Lausanne, Lehigh, Lower Towamensing (Districts 32 & 33), Mahoning (Districts 35, 36 & 38), Packer, Penn Forest (Districts 51-1, 51-2, 51-3, 51-4 & 51-5), Towamensing (Districts 56, 57-1 & 57-2) and Boroughs of Beaver Meadows, Bowmanstown, East Side, Jim Thorpe (Districts 14, 15, 16, 17 & 18), Lansford (Districts 23, 24 & 25), Lehighon (Districts 28, 29 & 30), Nesquehoning (Districts 41 & 42), Palmerton (Districts 47, 48 & 49), Parryville, Weatherly (Districts 58 & 61) and Weissport.
